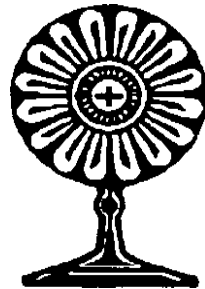
**Update Meeting for Liturgical Ministries**
