We will honor our Blessed Mother Mary during the annual parish May Crowning, to be held this year on Saturday, May 10th. We are moving our celebration just prior to the Vigil Mass so that we may incorporate praying the Rosary at both our outside and inside Marian shrines as part of our crowning ceremony.

We will begin at 4:45 p.m. inside the church, with opening remarks and praying a decade of the Rosary. Children will be invited to place flowers at our statue of Mary on the altar, and Mary will be crowned. We will then process outside to our statue of Mary on the side lawn, where we will pray two more decades of the Rosary and crown this statue. Our procession will then return to the church, where participants will be invited to take their seats in the pews and pray the final two decades of the Rosary.

Everyone is invited to participate. We encourage children, especially our First Communion students wearing their First Communion clothing, to take part in this ceremony. Confirmation candidates, too, are encouraged to participate, wearing their "Sunday best." Knights of Columbus with honor guard regalia are also invited to participate. Children who can bring spring flowers are asked to do so; those who cannot will be provided flowers. **In the event of inclement weather, May Crowning will take place entirely inside the church.**

ANNUAL PARISH COMMUNAL ANOINTING OF SICK SUNDAY, APRIL 27, 2008, at 12:00 NOON MASS

- We will have a communal celebration of the Anointing of the Sick on Sunday, April 27, at the 12:00 NOON Mass. Special greeters will be at the entrances to help with any special needs.
- Call the Parish Office with any needs or questions.
- A special brochure about this sacrament will be available at the church doors.
- Please join the community in Johnson Hall for social hour prior to Mass.

ALL WHO ARE SERIOUSLY ILL need the special help of God's grace in their time of anxiety. Christ strengthens the faithful who are afflicted by illness with this holy anointing. This sacrament provides the sick with the grace of the Holy Spirit by which the whole person is brought to health, trust in God is encouraged, and strength is given to resist the temptations of the Evil One and even anxiety about death.

Baptized Catholics who are in danger from illness include:

- a serious chronic illness such as diabetes
- a terminal illness such as some cancers
- a serious acute illness such as pneumonia
- an illness requiring a major surgery such as hip replacement
- old age, because of any weakened condition, although no dangerous illness is present
- serious illness from a mental health issue
- seriously ill children with sufficient use of reason who would be comforted by this sacrament.

THE PARISH CELEBRATES WITH THE SICK AT MASS, because all baptized Christians share in this ministry of mutual charity in the Body of Christ: by fighting against disease, by love shown to the sick, and by sharing in the actual anointing. We hope that many parishioners come to pray with our brothers and sisters suffering from illness.

This sacrament unites the sick person to the passion of Christ; gives strength and peace to endure in a Christian manner these sufferings; provides the sick person with the forgiveness of sins and the completion of Christian penance until they are able to confess; prays for restoration of physical health which is conducive with salvation; and ultimately prepares those who are dying for eternal life.

MINISTERS OF COMMUNION TO HOMEBOUND are encouraged to come to this Parish Anointing of the Sick Mass. At Communion time, you will be sent forth to your homebound person with Eucharist from this special Mass. Please discuss this option with your person.

CAREGIVERS OF THE SICK also are encouraged to attend this Mass where there will be a special blessing over them.

SHARING IN THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION is a good manner to prepare for this sacrament.

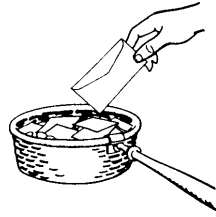

Respect Life

The Saint Michael the Archangel Organization is attempting to organize one million people in the United States to pray the Rosary for unborn babies on Saturday, May 3rd.
