- ❖ To foster the personal and communal holiness of Catholics and support them to deepen their commitment in living out the mission of the Church.
- ❖ To enhance quality of parish life throughout the Diocese of Columbus.
- ❖ To strengthen the presence and ministry of the Church in the urban, suburban and rural areas of the fifteen deaneries and twenty-three counties.
- ❖ To increase collaboration between and among leaders, parishes and the whole Diocese of Columbus.
- ❖ To act as good stewards of all human, financial and facility resources.
- ❖ To support increased understanding of an action for the assumptions and criteria related to vibrant parish life.
- ❖ To build a greater sense of unity within the rich ethnic, cultural and generational diversity present within the local Church.

The planning process is intended to help parishes evaluate their current ministries, plan for ways to enhance them and collaborate in order both to share and conserve resources so that ministries can be more fruitful.

The parish will benefit from this study by encouraging you, the laity, to take responsibility for your parish by assisting us in this parish self-study. We will be holding a ***Town Hall meeting on Tuesday, June 24th, from 7:00-9:00 p.m., in Johnson Hall.*** We are asking that you pencil this date on your calendar and make every effort to attend. Within this meeting, we will break out into sub groups in order to focus on the multiple facets of this self-study. We greatly need your response and willingness to participate and accomplish this project. We count on your support. I will put structures in place to guarantee and ensure that your efforts are fruitful.
