Dear Friends,

Some of you may remember that on the 1st Sunday of Easter, we celebrated Divine Mercy Sunday and the wonderful mercy that God gives to us through His Son Jesus Christ. That weekend, Fr. Streitenberger and I celebrated Confessions before each of the Sunday Masses so that members of the congregation could celebrate the Sacrament on the Feast Day. We were delighted with the number of people who took the opportunity to be reconciled to God. One person admitted to me that they saw the opportunity and took it for the first time in 15 years. What a wonderful thing – to realize that “now is the time” and to seize the moment. Since The Feast, we have been discussing whether or not we should start offering the Sacrament of Reconciliation at the Sunday Masses **every week**. We have decided we should! We want this great Sacrament to be available to as many people as possible, and in this hectic and busy world we recognize that it isn't always possible to get to church on Saturday evenings. Beginning on **September 7, 2008**, Confessions will be heard before all weekend Masses as follows:

Saturday: 4:00-5:00 p.m.; Sunday: 9:00-10:00 a.m.; Sunday: 11.30 a.m.-12:00 noon

This schedule will allow parishioners coming to the 8:00 a.m. Mass to go to Confession immediately afterwards, and those coming to the other Masses to go to Confession 30 minutes before each Mass begins.

As a result of this change, we will be discontinuing the Wednesday evening Confessions at that time. Wednesday evenings are always busy at St. Francis with appointments or parish meetings. For example, as I write this today, I know I will not stop this evening (even for dinner) from the 5.30 p.m. Mass until School Advisory Board finishes at 8:00 p.m. The gap at 6:00 p.m. will enable Fr. Streitenberger and I to say Evening Prayer and eat dinner before we begin again.

Father Streitenberger and I look forward to celebrating God's mercy with you!

Parish Pilgrimage to Carey, Ohio

The Father Bill Johnson Council of the Knights of Columbus is sponsoring a Parish Pilgrimage to Our Lady of Consolation Shrine in Carey, Ohio, on Sunday, August 10, 2008. Our plans are to charter a 55-passenger bus for this pilgrimage. If the bus is filled, the cost per seat will be \$12.50. If we do not sell out the bus, the cost per seat will need to be increased to cover costs. There is an **optional** cost of \$8.50 per person for lunch in the Shrine Cafeteria. We plan to leave from the **Park and Ride** (Route 16 freeway at the Dugway) at 7:30 a.m. We will be attending the 12:00 noon Mass with Fr. Adam Streitenberger and Fr. David Orians concelebrating. After Mass will be time for lunch and then the prayer service with the blessing of the true relic of our Lord's Crucifix. Immediately following, we will process to the park and pray the Stations of the Cross. We plan to be back in Newark by 7:00 p.m. This will be on a first-come, first-served basis.
