CHILD OF THE LIGHT

Reflection on Matthew 25:14-30

Today's parable follows immediately upon last week's story of the wise and foolish virgins in Matthew's Gospel; they both direct our attention to the last days and the Lord's coming. This story highlights for us the truth that there will be some kind of final accounting for our lives. As the servants report to their master on their use of "talents" entrusted to them, so each of us will be required to give an account of our lives to the Master, our Almighty God.

The affirmation of the second reading that we are "children of light," and the first reading's praise of "a worthy wife," and by implication, lifting up the gifts of all women, grab our attention. Perhaps these descriptions of our identity and purpose which flow from our divine inheritance (created in the image and likeness of God) can function as beacons for self-assessment, or an examination of conscience.

What does it mean to be a child of the light? In Baptism, we each "received the light of Christ... to be kept burning brightly." More than ever, the world needs the gifts of women and men to be in service of the Kingdom of God. With Baptism as the source of our mission and common priesthood, we spend our talents, our gifts, our very lives in service of God's reign, the Light that is conquering the darkness of this world.

SAINT ANDREW DUNG-LAC AND COMPANIONS

Feast Day: November 24

Andrew Dung-Lac, a Catholic convert ordained to the priesthood, was one of 117 people martyred in Vietnam between 1820 and 1862. Members of the companions group gave their lives for Christ in the 17th, 18th, and 19th centuries, and received beatification during four different occasions between 1900 and 1951. All were canonized during the papacy of Saint John Paul II.

Christianity came to Vietnam through the Portuguese. Severe persecutions were launched at least three times in the 19th century. During the six decades after 1820, between 100,000 and 300,000 Catholics were killed or subjected to great hardship. Foreign missionaries martyred in the first wave included priests of the Paris Mission Society, and Spanish Dominican priests and tertiaries.

In 1832, Emperor Minh-Mang banned all foreign missionaries, and tried to make all Vietnamese deny their faith by trampling on a crucifix. Like the priest-holes in Ireland during English persecution, many hiding places were offered in homes of the faithful.

Persecution broke out again in 1847, when the emperor suspected foreign missionaries and Vietnamese Christians of sympathizing with a rebellion led by one of his sons. The last, of the martyrs were 17 laypersons, one of them a 9-year-old, executed in 1862. That year a treaty with France guaranteed religious freedom to Catholics, but it did not stop all persecution.

During the Vietnamese war, Catholics again suffered in the north, and again moved to the south in great numbers. It may help people who associate Vietnam only with a 20th-century war to realize that the cross has long been a part of the lives of the people of that country. Even as some people ask again the unanswered questions about the United States' involvement and disengagement, the faith rooted in Vietnam's soil proves hardier than the forces that willed to destroy it.

ARE YOU REGISTERED AT ST. FRANCIS PARISH?

Registering in a parish is a declaration of your desire to be part of a Catholic community and to make a commitment to the life of that specific parish. Often, people come to us and request a sacrament, ask to be a godparent, volunteer to help with a liturgical ministry, or have another need and are surprised to learn they aren't registered as an active member of the parish. Once someone is 18-25 years of age, he/she should register on his/her own in the parish even if he/she still lives at home with parents

who are registered. Ministries at any parish are driven by the number of registered households and the makeup of those households. This allows the parish to make decisions about the type of faith formation, social activities, and outreach needed to ensure a thriving community. If you have questions about this, please contact the Parish Office. Staff members will be happy to check your registration status for you.
