

GOD'S CALL

Reflection on Luke 1:26-38

The Gospel for this fourth Sunday of Advent is the familiar visitation scene – God calling Mary to be the mother of His Son. With her "yes," Mary is elevated from an obscure teenager to be the mother of God, from a time-and-spacebound human being to Queen of Heaven, from a prayerful supplicant to the eternal go-to Lady for intercession and perpetual help! The interruption of the incarnation becomes, for Mary, the path to holiness: "Blessed are you among women!"

In these final days of Advent waiting and preparation, consider how the incarnation – the birth of Jesus both in human history and in this very moment of your life – calls you to God's higher purposes. With Mary as our pattern of holiness, God is revealing some of what God wants from us: to be a co-creator of life, a nurturer, a font of love, a teacher, a healer, a reconciler, a prophet, a companion. "May it be done to me according to your word."

SAINT JOHN THE EVANGELIST

Feast Day: December 27 Patron Saint of: Turkey

It is God who calls; human beings answer. The vocation of John and his brother James is stated very simply in the Gospels, along with that of Peter and his brother Andrew: Jesus called them; they followed. For the three former fishermen—Peter, James and John—that faith was to be rewarded by a special friendship with Jesus, but John's friendship was even more special. John's own Gospel refers to him as "the disciple whom Jesus loved" (see John 13:23; 19:26; 20:2), the one who reclined next to Jesus at the Last Supper, and the one to whom Jesus gave the exquisite honor of caring for his mother, as John stood beneath the cross. "Woman, behold your son.... Behold, your mother" (John 19:26b, 27b).

On the first Easter, Mary Magdalene "ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, 'They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him'" (John 20:2). John recalls, perhaps with a smile, that he and Peter ran side by side, but then "the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first" (John 20:4b). He did not enter, but waited for Peter and let him go in first. "Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed" (John 20:8).

John was with Peter when the first great miracle after the Resurrection took place—the cure of the man crippled from birth—which led to their spending the night in jail together. The mysterious experience of the Resurrection is perhaps best contained in the words of Acts: "Observing the boldness of Peter and John and perceiving them to be uneducated, ordinary men, they [the questioners] were amazed, and they recognized them as the companions of Jesus" (Acts 4:13).

"The way we came to know love was that he laid down his life for us; so we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers" (1 John 3:16).

AROUND THE DIOCESE

A NOTE FROM THE COLUMBUS DIOCESE

Over a year ago, a discussion began regarding a potential merger between the dioceses of Columbus and Steubenville. That discussion was tabled for a time. Fast forward to now, the Apostolic Nunciature has asked Bishop Fernandes and Bishop Bradley (Apostolic Administrator of Steubenville) to lead their respective diocesan leadership teams to coalesce data to be presented to the Holy Father, in order that he may discern a path forward.

Last week, leadership from both dioceses met to begin that work. The final decision will come from the Holy Father; however, at this time, no decision has been made. A joint statement between the dioceses of Columbus and Steubenville has been released publicly and can be found on the St. Francis Parish website.
