Reflection on Mark 1:21-28

"All were amazed and asked one another, 'What is this?'" Through many years of ministry, countless relationships, extensive travel, and everyday experiences, I have been surprised and amazed at what God is up to, over and over again.

SAINT ANSGAR

Saint of the Day: February 3 Patron Saint of: Denmark

The "apostle of the north" (Scandinavia) had enough frustrations to become a saint – and he did. He became a Benedictine at Corbie, France, where he had been educated. Three years later, when the king of Denmark became a convert, Ansgar went to that country for three years of missionary work, without noticeable success. Sweden asked for Christian missionaries, and he went there, suffering capture by pirates and other hardships on the way. Fewer than two years later, he was recalled, to become abbot of New Corbie (Corvey) and bishop of Hamburg. After 13 years work in Hamburg, Ansgar saw it burned to the ground by invading Northmen; Sweden and Denmark returned to paganism.

He directed new apostolic activities in the North, traveling to Denmark and being instrumental in the conversion of another king. By the strange device of casting lots, the king of Sweden allowed the Christian missionaries to return.

Ansgar's biographers remark that he was an extraordinary preacher, a humble and ascetical priest. He was devoted to the poor and the sick, imitating the Lord in washing their feet and waiting on them at table. He died peacefully at Bremen, Germany.

Sweden became pagan again after his death, and remained so until the coming of missionaries two centuries later.

History records what people do, rather than what they are. Yet the courage and perseverance of men and women like Ansgar can only come from a solid base of union with the original courageous and persevering Missionary. Ansgar's life is another reminder that God writes straight with crooked lines. Christ takes care of the effects of the apostolate in His own way; He is first concerned about the purity of the apostles themselves.

Hritsko on administrative leave, effective immediately. I have been appointed as the temporary Parish Administrator of both parishes until either Fr. Hritsko returns to the pastorate, or in the event that he resigns as pastor, a new pastor can be named by our Bishop. I expect that this arrangement could last up to six months, until the middle of July. Please rest assured, I will continue to fulfill my ministry and responsibilities to the St. Francis community with the ongoing support of our capable Associate Pastor, Fr. Mike Gentry, my awesome Senior Leadership Team, the dedicated Staff, and the many volunteer leaders of our parish ministries and programs. For instance, Fr. Mike and I, along with some retired priests, will help with the Masses at these two parishes. Utilizing retired priests for Masses, will allow Fr. Mike and I continue to be here regularly at SFDS. Only he and I will be covering the weekend and weekday Masses at SFDS.

Please look to Our Lord and ask for the prayers of Our Lady as we offer spiritual support, for a temporary period of time, to our fellow neighboring Catholics who are affected by this news.
