#### PALMS FOR ASH WEDNESDAY

Blessed Palms from previous years can be brought to the Church to be burned into ashes for use on Ash Wednesday. You may place them in the baskets at

the rear of the church by next weekend. Please place only palms in the basket; remove bands, plastic bags, etc. Thank you!

**PLEASE NOTE:** Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day are both on February 14, 2024. Bishop Fernandes will <u>not</u> be issuing a dispensation for this day. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence; all from age 14 until age 59 are expected to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays throughout the Lenten Season (Canon 1250-1253).

### **VESSELS OF GRACE**

Reflection on Mark 1:29-39

An illness or disease, whether physical, emotional, or spiritual, especially if chronic or persistent, can make daily life seem a drudgery and empty a person of any joy or happiness. The complaints of Job in the first reading echo the miserable feelings many sick people endure. Is it any wonder that so much of Jesus' ministry involves healing, curing diseases, and driving out demons? There is always more in these healing stories than just the restoration of health; an accompanying inner healing or transformation leads to new attitudes open once again to joy and meaning in life.

Notice also that the response of Simon's mother-in-law, after being healed by Jesus, is to serve. This is always the appropriate response to grace – to give it away again in acts of love and service. Grace is meant to be shared, and in sharing what we have received, we become vessels of grace, bearing Christ to those we meet in our journey who are in need of healing and strength.

# SAINT SCHOLASTICA

Saint of the Day: February 10
Patron Saint of: Cloistered Nuns

Born in 480 of wealthy parents, twins, Scholastica and Benedict were brought up together until he left central Italy for Rome to continue his studies. Little is known of Scholastica's early life. She founded a religious community for women near Monte Cassino at Plombariola, five miles from where her brother governed a monastery.

The twins visited each other once a year in a farmhouse because Scholastica was not permitted inside the monastery. They spent these times discussing spiritual matters.

According to the Dialogues of St. Gregory the Great, the brother and sister spent their last day together in prayer and conversation. Scholastica sensed her death was close at hand and she begged Benedict to stay with her until the next day. He refused her request because he did not want to spend a night outside the monastery, thus breaking his own Rule. Scholastica asked God to let her brother remain and a severe thunderstorm broke out, preventing Benedict and his monks from returning to the abbey. Benedict cried out, "God forgive you, Sister. What have you done?" Scholastica replied, "I asked a favor of you and you refused. I asked it of God and he granted it."

Brother and sister parted the next morning after their long discussion. Three days later, Benedict was praying in his monastery and saw the soul of his sister rising heavenward in the form of a white dove. Benedict then announced the death of his sister to the monks and later buried her in the tomb he had prepared for himself.

Scholastica and Benedict gave themselves totally to God and gave top priority to deepening their friendship with him through prayer. In coming closer to Christ they found they were also closer to each other.






# PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN SESSION


#### SPECIAL BLESSING AT MASS




### SURRENDERING THE SECRET ABORTION RECOVERY




