AN IMPORTANT NOTE FROM FR. DAVE - The Sacrament of Anointing at St. Francis

On February 11, 2024, Bishop Fernandes offered some clarifications on practices surrounding the reception of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Here are some important points to keep in mind regarding the reception of this Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick here at St. Francis:

- 1. Canon Law and the Ritual stipulate that the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is for those who, having reached the age of reason, are in danger of death, whether as a result of illness or old age (c. 1004). Those who do not meet these criteria, such as infants, young children prior to the age of reason, and those who lack a serious illness that places them in danger of death, are not to receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. This includes even those who, though undergoing elective surgery, are not seriously ill. The administration of anesthesia does not constitute a grave illness.
- 2. The aged and infirm may be anointed on account of the danger of death or the beginning of the danger of death.
- 3. Some types of mental sickness are now classified as serious. Those who are judged to have a serious mental illness and now would be strengthened by the sacrament may be anointed.
- 4. The appropriate sacraments for dealing with "interior woundedness" are the Sacrament of Penance and the Holy Eucharist.
- 5. Anointing within Mass is to be celebrated strictly according to the norms found in PCS, 131-134. In particular:
 - a. Not all in attendance at Masses where the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is celebrated are to be invited indiscriminately to be anointed but only those whose illness is of a serious nature.
 - b. Only those whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age are proper subjects for the sacrament.

We will follow these clarifications when we are called upon to visit parishioners in the hospital, nursing homes, the homebound, and when we offer this Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick during a weekend Mass. Please note that we will no longer be offering the quarterly anointings after Mass, but will announce when a special anointing does occur.

MAGNETIC PULL

Reflection on John 12:20-33

In the story of Abraham, we encounter faith as obedience to the summons of God; faith as a venture, a journey, where God is present in the midst of our historical lives, in the realm of concrete events and personal relationships.

This is clearly the God we encounter in today's readings, in the prophecy of Jeremiah, who tells us that God is written into our hearts, and in the Christ of the Gospel, who is even now drawing all hearts to Himself. Our hearts are like magnets, drawn by their very design to the source and power of love that is God. Christ is doing the drawing; He is the magnetic field, if you will. And our lives are a journey, like Abraham made, to that place of blessing promised to us by God. We walk by faith, our obedience to facing the demands of the journey.

Jeremiah unveils a certain truth, a key to the mystery of obedience along the journey with Christ. The prophet says, "No longer will they have to teach their friends and kinsfolk how to know the Lord. All, from least to greatest shall know me, says the Lord." The leap into the light, the illogic that is faith, is not unknown to us. It is written into our very hearts, our very beings, if only we would allow Christ, the magnetic pull of God's love, to draw us to Himself.

Reservations required by Wednesday, 3/20. Aged 8 and up \$5 pp. and Pre-K -7 free!



ARE YOU REGISTERED AT ST. FRANCIS PARISH?

Registering in a parish is a declaration of your desire to be part of a Catholic community and to make a commitment to the life of that specific parish. Often, people come to us and request a sacrament, ask to be a godparent, volunteer to help with a liturgical ministry, or have another need and are surprised to learn they aren't registered as an active member of the parish. Once someone is 18-25 years of age, he/she should register on his/her own in the parish even if he/ she still lives at home with parents who are registered. Ministries at any parish are driven by the number of registered households and the makeup of those households. This allows the parish to make decisions about the type of faith formation, social activities, and outreach needed to ensure a thriving community. If you have questions about this, please contact the Parish Office. Staff members will be happy to check your registration status for you.

LENTEN ACTIVITIES

THE FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT

The period following the Fifth Sunday of Lent has traditionally been called Passiontide. Veiling of crosses statues and pictures is perhaps based on the notion of a "fast of the eyes." Christ veiled His divinity during His passion. "Jesus hid himself and left the temple." Veiling crosses reminds us of the Redeemer's humiliation and thus imprints the image of the crucified Christ more deeply on our hearts. The practice of veiling images alerts us that something is different. It can be startling at first, but the last two weeks of Lent are a time of immediate preparation for the celebration of the Sacred Triduum. The veils are hard to miss, and they serve as a reminder to get ready! When images are unveiled before the Easter Vigil, we are reminded that we, in a sense, live in a veiled world. It is through our own death that we are able to see our true home, and the veil is lifted. Christ lifts the veil through His Resurrection.

We are invited to keep watch with Jesus in the Adoration Chapel after the Holy Thursday Mass until 11pm, when we will conclude with evening prayer.



SPIRITUAL ADOPTION OF AN UNBORN CHILD

You might be asking, "What is the Spiritual Adoption Program?" It is very simple. The prayer (initially offered by Bishop Fulton J. Sheen) is said for a nine-month period, ending on Christmas Day. Participants pledge to pray for nine months for a baby in danger of abortion. While this child will remain unknown to his or her "spiritual family," God knows who the child is. Many people have found that naming their child helps to keep them focused on the reality that their prayers are helping to save a particular baby from the harm of abortion. It is suggested that you pray the prayer with your children. To coincide with the Feast of the Annunciation on Monday, 4/8, beginning the weekend before, prayer cards and a flyer will be placed at all church exits. Please feel free to use the flyer which shows the development of a child throughout the nine-

month period. The brochure could be a helpful tool in discussing the development of a baby with your child, as it grows in the mother's womb. Please use these to pray for and spiritually adopt an unborn child.
