

REMAIN IN

Reflection on John 15:1-8

Within John the Evangelist's compelling image of the Church as "vine and branches," we hear Jesus say these words to us today: "Remain in me, as I remain in you." Recently, I have begun praying with and reflecting on these simple words many times throughout each day.

What does it mean to "remain in...?" Primarily and foundationally, it means that the Risen One, the Christ, is within each of us at all times, places, situations. This recalls the promise of Jesus at the end of Matthew's Gospel: "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Matthew 28: 20). This is, in a sense, the second incarnation; the Word taking on flesh in Jesus of Nazareth is the first, and the Christ taking up residence in each one of us the second.

For us to remain in the Christ, there is some pruning that must take place. Gardeners know that plants respond to losing branches by putting more energy forth to regrow. Pruning our lives of the clutter of attachments, possessions, harmful attitudes and behaviors, allows the grace of God to be at work in us so that we can bear beautiful fruit for God and His Kingdom. ~ Fr. SAINT JOSEPH THE WORKER

Saint of the Day: May 1 Patron Saint of: Universal Church

Pope Pius XII instituted the feast of Saint Joseph the Worker in 1955. This feast extends the long relationship between Joseph and the cause of workers in both Catholic faith and devotion. Beginning in the Book of Genesis, the dignity of human work has long been celebrated as a participation in the creative work of God. By work, humankind both fulfills the command found in Genesis to care for the earth (Gn 2:15) and to be productive in their labors. Saint Joseph, the carpenter and foster father of Jesus, is but one example of the holiness of human labor.

Jesus, too, was a carpenter. He learned the trade from Saint Joseph and spent his early adult years working side-by-side in Joseph's carpentry shop before leaving to pursue his ministry as preacher and healer. Pope John Paul II stated: "the Church considers it her task always to call attention to the dignity and rights of those who work, to condemn situations in which that dignity and those rights are violated, and to help to guide [social] changes so as to ensure authentic progress by man and society."

Saint Joseph is held up as a model of such work. Pius XII emphasized this when he said, "The spirit flows to you and to all men from the heart of the God-man, Savior of the world, but certainly, no worker was ever more completely and profoundly penetrated by it than the foster father of Jesus, who lived with Him in closest intimacy and community of family life and work."

In 1870, Pope Pius IX declared Saint Joseph the patron of the universal Church. In 1955, Pope Pius XII added the feast of Saint Joseph the Worker. This silent saint, who was given the noble task of caring and watching over the Virgin Mary and Jesus, now cares for and watches over the Church and models for all the dignity of human work.


We just got exciting news from the Vatican: key moments in the National Eucharistic Revival are now opportunities to gain a plenary indulgence! A decree


